### **The Cost of Discipleship**

*Luke 9:57-62*

Many in the church will insist that salvation is free. And it is, for the word will affirm this truth. In the Old Testament we find this word:

*Everyone who thirsts, come to the waters, and he who has no money, come, buy and eat. Come buy wine and milk without price. Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy. (Isaiah 55:1-2)*

The prophet is reminding the people of God that God's love is free. In this text the prophet is reminding us that God offers us his love and it will not cost us anything, except to accept it with our whole heart, soul and mind.

And he repeats this teaching in the New Testament when he says,

*God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, so that whosoever believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. (John 3:16)*

The Bible says he gave his son, it did not say he charged for it. The word said *he gave*. In other words, salvation is free because Jesus gave his life for all people to have a right relationship with our heavenly Father.

Now I believe that we all can agree that salvation is free and it is easy enough to obtain. All we have to do is confess with our lips and believe in our hearts and we can be saved. (Romans 10:8-9)

But the real problem comes in when we are asked to follow Jesus. For it cost something to follow where Jesus is leading us, for we can't go to where he is leading without giving up something and being committed. We have got to put aside selfishness, envy, strife, and jealousy to go with Jesus.

In the hymn *Where He Leads Me* (written by E. W. Blandy) we find these words:

*I can hear my Savior calling, Take thy cross and follow, follow me.  
Where He leads me I will follow, I'll go with Him, with Him, all the way.  
He will give me grace and glory, And go with me, with me all the way.*

It cost something to be a disciple of Jesus Christ and to follow his teachings. Even in a natural sense, I have been asked to follow someone to a destination in my car. I had to buy gas to get there, even if I was following behind them. When I arrived, I sometimes had to spend more money if they were not taking care of the expenses.

Well, the same is true in the spiritual sense. We can't be a disciple of Jesus without counting up the cost, because it will cost something in return. In Luke 9:57-62 Jesus has asked three people to count the cost of discipleship and follow him. The first person made a public declaration to follow Jesus wherever he goes. But Jesus said to him I have no world security and if you go with me you will be subject to the goodness of the people of God. The second one he asked to follow him wanted to go back and bury his father. And the third wanted time to go back and say good bye to his family.

Often in the church we are not willing to follow because we are not sure if the person that we are following is leading us the right way. But in order to be lead, we must be willing to invest some time in becoming a leader ourselves. Often we have the less knowledgeable person trying to lead persons with a stronger relationship with God. Every church leader must be willing to study God's word to become more familiar with it so they can help the pastor lead God's people. Both clergy and laity must be leaders in offering the word of God to God's people. But what happens is that many want to lead where they are not prepared to go themselves.

Yes discipleship is costly. And we must be willing to go where God is leading us. But when we follow Jesus there are so many blessing we will receive along the way. In his sermon, *The Great Privilege of Those That Are Born of God*, John Wesley says that “being a disciple is like a child being born into the world. He says that a child born feels that air that sustains him or her all around and it feels its lungs filling up with that air. And the eyes of the child are open to the world around him or her and the ears that could not hear the sounds of life now perceive so many sounds of God’s creation.”

Now if we follow John Wesley’s logic, we can conclude that the more we follow Jesus and study his word the more we grow in his grace. As we follow, the more air we breathe, the more light we see, and the sounds of the presence of God we experience; the more of God’s blessings we will be able to share with others.

When we follow Jesus it is costly and sometimes it requires more sacrifice than we are willing to give. We might have to give up some personal hopes and dreams; sometimes traditions of family; sometimes certain friends are less priority. But the value of our relationship with Jesus Christ is worth the cost.

According to Luke 9, when some people saw Jesus had set his sight on Jerusalem, they decided they would not follow him any longer. People are usually alright to follow as long as God is not making us give up our comfort zones and lets us hang with friends. If God lets us keep our life the same and just worship him on Sunday every now and then, we can live with following him and we are alright.

However, when he wants us to get our hands dirty doing things that we are not accustomed to, he is asking too much. Some believe they are above some things God asks of us. They believe they are special and not suppose to be doing servant type work of any kind. For I am somebody, this is what we say to ourselves.

Is the cost of discipleship too high? Is following Jesus really worth it? You decide.

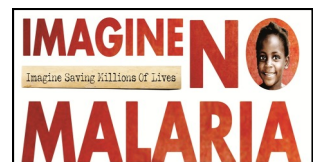
Lenten blessings from Donna Banks, District Superintendent...

**Blow the horn in Zion: give a shout on my holy mountain! Let all the people of the land tremble, for the day of the Lord is coming. Joel 2:1**

During this time of the year, I remember growing up on the Gulf Coast and enjoying the season of Mardi Gras—the parades, the beads, saltwater taffy, and moon pies! We looked forward to Fat Tuesday, a day off from school and a day full of celebration with parades until midnight. For most people, Fat Tuesday marked the end of Mardi Gras. For Christians, Fat Tuesday was the day of celebration and eating rich foods before the ritual of fasting during the Lenten season.

During this season of preparation, self-reflection and repentance, we seek to literally “turn around” and re-align our lives to God. We may choose to “give up” things or “take on” new life-giving practices, helping us rid ourselves of distractions and our own selfish desires. In doing so, we seek to grow as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.

During the last Annual Conference, the North Carolina Conference established a goal of \$1,000,000 to be raise by June 2015 for **Imagine No Malaria**. The goal for the Corridor District is \$100,000 or \$1,000/church. During the middle of Lent, the Corridor District will host the **Skeeter Run** to support this effort. The season of Lent would be a good time to continue the journey with weekly themes embodying the spirit of Lent:



**Give Up Indifference ~ Give Up Excess ~ Take Up the Charge ~ Take Up the Challenge  
Lift Up the Hurting ~ Lift Up the Healed ~ Look Up to Overcome**

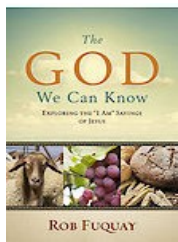

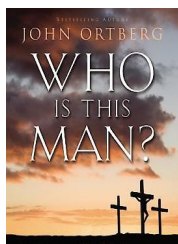

### Pastor Jesse's Class and Wednesday Morning Bible Study: *The God We Can Know* by Rob Fuquay



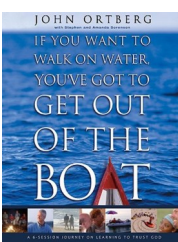

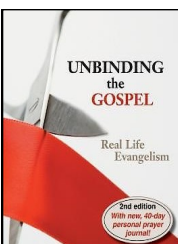
### Clyde Walker Class

*Matthew 11:29 Take My Yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.*

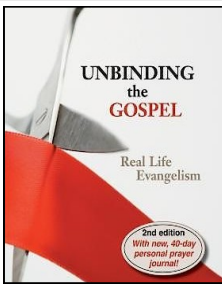

## Pleasant Green is *Unbinding the Gospel!*

The theme of the first 2015 Connectional Table meeting on January 24th, was “Connecting in Ministry”. At this meeting, Pastor Brunson brought *Unbinding the Gospel* to the group, and we decided to embark on an 8-week study, to learn how to better connect with one another (as members of PGUMC), how to better connect with the community and how to better reach those who do not yet know Jesus Christ. We are really talking about effective “faith sharing” or “evangelism”.

### **Book: *Unbinding the Gospel: Real Life Evangelism***

This book discusses the research of Martha Grace Reese, MDiv, JD, and her colleagues-- they found churches that are growing despite the majority of mainline churches seeing declines in membership. These churches are doing effective evangelism. Researchers looked at what motivates their faith sharing (evangelism), as well as the honest, loving relationships that exist within these churches (relationships with God, within the congregation, and with people outside of the church). Lastly, this book will help us to implement these learned strategies at our own church, and help Pleasant Green grow in its faith and in its membership by further reaching out to the community and those who do not yet know Jesus Christ.
